## "I'm Very Unsettled By Things... What Should I Do Now?"

In caring for family members or clients, we often encounter ethical situations where we might ask ourselves: "What should I do now?" or "Are We Doing the Right Thing?" We may feel unsettled; others might experience moral uncertainty; some will experience ethical concerns or challenges as dilemmas; while others still, in addition to feeling the stresses of care giving, may feel moral distress as they navigate difficult circumstances with loved ones or professional care providers. In reflecting about these experiences, we may never use the word "ethics".
